

About Reflection Ministries

The purpose of Reflection Ministries is to share the love of God with those who have been touched by cancer. It is an outreach of hope and encouragement, particularly to prostate cancer patients and their families. This ministry began early in 1998, while Bill was undergoing treatment for prostate cancer at the Radiotherapy Clinics of Georgia (RCOG, www.RCOG.com). Men with prostate cancer come from around the world for this unique treatment, and live in this area for approximately ten weeks.

Monday Night Dinner

Since March of 1998, the Frisbees have been hosting dinners every other week at their home for these men and their wives. The home atmosphere is relaxed and gives an opportunity for Christian witness, encouragement, counseling, and discipleship. In addition to offering a delicious home cooked meal and time to get to know one another, there is also time to sit around the piano and sing and share lives that have been touched with prostate cancer.

Bill and Margaret are assisted by an excellent team of volunteers.

Bill grew up in Miami, FL. He is a graduate of Belhaven College in Jackson, MS, and Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, GA. He has served as a pastor in Fort Lauderdale and Baton Rouge and as interim pastor of churches in the Atlanta area.

Margaret grew up in Alexandria, LA, and met Bill at Belhaven College. One of her passions is music, which has led her to direct children, youth, and adult choirs for over 30 years.

Men's Support Group

Every other Thursday, Bill facilitates a men's support group held in the Resource Center at the RCOG Decatur location. This is an important time for the men to discuss any side effects of radiation or other problems, and to interact with one another.

Ladies' Lunch Bunch

On that same day, wives of cancer patients and ladies undergoing cancer treatment are invited to a luncheon at the Barnett's home in Stone Mountain. This is a time for getting to know new friends, and for encouragement and inspiration. Margaret is a co-host of the Lunch Bunch.

Hospital Visitation

The implanting of the radioactive seeds is generally an outpatient procedure. It is still an anxious time for the family. The Frisbees are available to visit with the spouse or family in the surgical waiting room and pray with them.

Reunions

Each year the Frisbees assist Dr. Critz with the Radiation Vacation Reunion. This is a time of fellowship, fun, renewing friendships, and making special memories. Patients and alumni look forward to this event. Bill and Margaret also visit past patients, and have participated in mini-reunions from Pennsylvania to Washington State, and from Connecticut to Tennessee.

Internet Opportunities

The internet has added a new dimension to Bill & Margaret's ministry and has afforded them the ability to stay in touch with former patients via email. Keeping an accurate data base and notes of friendship and encouragement are a daily part of ministry. A prayer e-letter is sent every other week to those wanting to be a part of the prayer team.
